The same equivalent recurs in 4 at vs. 14, where the others use arkaneli. Similarly the texts a 1, 2, 3 have changed from arkaneli in Rev. 611 to handerts in 79 in rendering oroXa?, but 4 has uniformly adhered to the equivalent it uses in verses 13 and 14, viz., patmutschan, and it is worth noticing that in Mc. 1G5 the Armenian version renders...



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
